COVID-19 Updates

- DMV offices will remain closed until May 11th. State police will not ticket expired inspections or license plates through July.
- The Virginia Department of Social Services launched a brand new COVID-19 Virginia Resources website and COVID VA mobile app (available today for iOS users in the App Store - Android/Google Play forthcoming). Designed as a "one-stop" resource for individuals, families and businesses to access benefits, services and critical information, the website and app aim to connect an essential need whether food, child care, healthcare, housing, unemployment insurance, or more - with an immediate and actionable resource. - Absentee Ballot Last Day to Apply: May 12th: The last day to "officially" apply for an Absentee Ballot to be mailed is now <u>Tuesday</u>, May 12. Practically speaking, because of delivery times, the last day should be Friday, May 8. The Fauquier County Office of the General Registrar's will continue to be open for in-person absentee voting from 8 am until 4:30 pm Monday through Friday.
 - Absentee Ballot Last Day to Vote: Saturday, May 16—the last day to vote absentee. The Fauquier County Office of the General Registrar will be open from 9 am until 5 pm.

Do I Qualify for Unemployment Benefits During COVID19?

The Virginia Employment Commission (VEC) administers the unemployment insurance program that provides temporary financial assistance to individuals who become unemployed through no fault of their own. Benefits are paid through taxes on employers covered under the Virginia Unemployment Compensation Act. No part of the cost of your unemployment benefits is deducted from your earnings. Your name and social security number will be cross-matched with the Social Security Administration to verify your identity. * PLEASE APPLY IF YOU **ARE UNSURE***

The Federal government has allowed state to change their unemployment benefits laws. It lets them provide unemployment benefits for situations related to COVID-19:

 Self-employed workers and gig workers

To receive unemployment benefits .

- All unemployed workers to receive an extra \$600 a week for up to six months.
- Unemployed workers to get an extra 13 weeks of benefits beyond the number a state currently provide.
