Election 2020



General Information

A general election will be held in Fauquier County on Tuesday, November 3, 2020. Offices on the ballot will include president and vice president of the United States, members of the U.S. Senate and House of Representatives.

Three Ways to Vote: All registered voters in Virginia now have the option to vote at home, vote early or vote on Election Day.

1. Vote at Home - All registered voters in Virginia are eligible to request, receive, mark and return their ballot all from the comfort of their own home. Not only is it easy, but it's safe and secure too.

Please note that if you request that a ballot be mailed to you and decide you would like to vote early in-person or on election day you must bring the ballot with you in order to vote. The deadline for receipt of your request by mail, email, or fax is 5:00 pm on the eleventh (11th) day before the election (October 23.)

The witness signature is no longer required on the envelope containing the voted ballot for the November 3, 2020 general and special elections. Providing or not providing a witness signature will have no bearing on the validity of mailed absentee ballots for this election.

Important Dates & Deadlines:

- Deadline to request a ballot be mailed to you October 23, 2020 at 5:00 p.m.
- Deadline to return your mail ballot postmarked no later than November 3, 2020

2.Vote Early - Please note that if you have requested that a ballot be mailed to you, you must have that ballot with you and turn it in if you change your mind and decide to vote early. Before you head to an early voting site:

- Check your registration and make sure everything is correct on the Virginia Department of Elections Citizen Portal.*
- Have your acceptable ID with you. This includes voter card, driver's license, state ID card, and more. Check out the sample ballots so you can get in, vote, and get moving safely.
- Be prepared for social distancing measures in place at all locations.
- Bring your mask! Face coverings are required when entering county facilities.

Important Dates & Deadlines:

In-person early voting will be available at the following locations during the specified dates and times provided. In addition, early voting will also be conducted at these same locations on the following Saturdays, October 24 and 31, from 9:00am to 5:00pm.

Early voting ends on October 31 at 5:00pm. Absentee ballot drop-boxes will be available inside each location provided below during the dates and times listed for each location.

3. Vote on Election Day -

If you live in The Plains - Vote at The Plains Precinct, Grace Episcopal Church, 6507 Main St, The Plains.

If you live Marshall - Vote at Marshall Precinct,
Marshall Ruritan Club, 8400 Salem Ave, Marshall.

Polls will be open from 6:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m.
on November 3.

Health Updates

Free Flu Shots

Getting a flu vaccine is the single best way to protect against the flu. The Rappahannock-Rapidan Health District will offer free flu shots at three locations this October. The free walk-in/drive thru clinics will be held on the following days in October:

- Monday, October 5, from 4 to 7 p.m. at Prospect Heights Middle, 202 Dailey Drive, Orange.
- Thursday, October 8, from 4:40 to 7 p.m. at Fauquier High School, 705 Waterloo Road, Warrenton.
- October 12, from 4:30 to 7 p.m. at Grace Miller Elementary, 6248 Catlett Road, Bealeton.
- October 19, from 4 to 7 p.m. at Rappahannock County Elementary, 34 School House Rd, Washington.

A limited number of doses of vaccine will be available at each clinic, and will be offered to anyone 3 years and older on a first-come, first-served basis, until 7 p.m. or until the supply of flu vaccine runs out. In addition to offering a free service to the community, these clinics will serve as a training drill to test local capabilities for giving vaccines or medication in an emergency situation.

Influenza, or "the flu," is a highly-contagious respiratory disease. Typical flu symptoms include fever, dry cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, headache, muscle aches and fatigue.

This year's seasonal flu vaccine will protect you against the four most expected flu strains. It could keep you from losing valuable time from work, school, and could even save your life. These clinics offer a fast and efficient way to vaccinate a large number of people in a short time.

The vaccination is especially important for people at higher risk of complications from the flu. These groups include:

- Pregnant and postpartum women, or those who will be pregnant during the influenza season;
- Persons over 65 years of age, including residents of nursing homes and long-term care facilities;
- People who have chronic lung or heart problems, including asthma; and
- People who have other serious medical conditions, such as diabetes, kidney disease, cystic fibrosis, anemia, cancer, weak immune systems (including those with HIV) or a seizure disorder.

Each year in the U.S. approximately 200,000 people are hospitalized due to flu illness, and flu-related deaths range from 3,000 to 49,000 each year, averaging 24,000 per year over the last three decades.

To minimize your risk of catching the flu and passing it on to others, follow these simple steps:

- Get a flu shot each year;
- Wash your hands frequently and thoroughly, for at least 20 seconds;
- Cover your cough by using a disposable tissue or coughing into your sleeve, not your hand; and
- Stay home when you are sick.
