# **Election 2020**



### **General Information**

A general election will be held in Loudoun County on Tuesday, November 3, 2020. Offices on the ballot will include president and vice president of the United States, members of the U.S. Senate and House of Representatives and Loudoun County bond questions.

Three Ways to Vote: All registered voters in Virginia now have the option to vote at home, vote early or vote on Election Day.

1. Vote at Home - All registered voters in Virginia are eligible to request, receive, mark and return their ballot all from the comfort of their own home. Not only is it easy, but it's safe and secure too.

Please note that if you request that a ballot be mailed to you and decide you would like to vote early in-person or on election day you must bring the ballot with you in order to vote.

If you will be completing your ballot and then dropping it off at the Office of Elections or an early voting site please make sure it is in 'Envelope B' and that Envelope B is in the purple envelope. This will ensure that we can mark your ballot as returned and turn it over to the Absentee Precinct for processing.

# **Important Dates & Deadlines:**

- Deadline to request a ballot be mailed to you October 23, 2020 at 5:00 p.m.
- Deadline to return your mail ballot postmarked no later than November 3, 2020

2.Vote Early - Please note that if you have requested that a ballot be mailed to you, you must have that ballot with you and turn it in if you change your mind and decide to vote early. Before you head to an early voting site:

- Check your registration and make sure everything is correct on the Virginia Department of Elections Citizen Portal.\*
- Have your acceptable ID with you. This includes voter card, driver's license, state ID card, and more.
   Check out the sample ballots so you can get in, vote, and get moving safely.
- Be prepared for social distancing measures in place at all locations.
- Bring your mask! Face coverings are required when entering county facilities.

# **COVID-19 Updates**



Loudoun County officials recommend that residents do not engage in traditional door-to-door trick-or-treating this Halloween or other activities that risk transmission of COVID-19.

"We all have a role in making Halloween as safe as possible this year by taking precautions that limit the spread of COVID-19 in our community," said Loudoun County Health Director Dr. David Goodfriend. "We encourage parents and anyone planning to participate

in Halloween-related events to take actions to protect themselves, their children and others from the virus that causes this disease."

Halloween activities that are considered high-risk and are not recommended include:

- Traditional trick-or-treating where treats are handed to children who go door to door.
- Trick-or-treating at houses where individuals are not wearing a face covering and where 6 feet of physical distance is not maintained between individuals.
- Trunk-or-treating where treats are handed out from trunks of cars lined up in large parking lots.
- Events that involve large gatherings, such as crowded costume parties held indoors and any events where social distancing is difficult to maintain.
- Indoor haunted houses where people may be crowded together and screaming.

For those who are planning to participate in Halloween events, officials urge these precautions:

- Stay home and away from others when sick.
- Stay at least 6 feet from others at all times.
- Wash your hands before and during trick-or-treating or handing out candy. Use hand sanitizer when soap and water aren't available.
- Wear a cloth face covering under costume masks. Halloween masks may not fit snugly and may not protect against inhaling respiratory droplets from other people.
- If you choose to offer candy, hand out candy outside and from a distance. Consider setting up a table and placing individually-wrapped treats so that multiple people do not have to reach into the same bowl. For trunk-or-treating, create distance between cars by parking in every other space.

In addition, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends staying home and away from others when sick. Anyone who has been diagnosed with COVID-19 and has not met the criteria for when it is safe to be around others, has COVID-19 symptoms or who has been in recent contact with someone with the disease should not participate in Halloween activities this year.

The Health Department considers haunted houses to be particularly risky for spreading COVID-19 because they typically involve people screaming, which is known to increase the production of respiratory droplets. Haunted houses that choose to operate must strictly follow Phase 3 Guidelines for Entertainment and Public Amusement settings (PDF).

Free COVID-19 Testing: HealthWorks is offering testing for new and current patients. # What's Happening This Month



Loudoun County's K-6 Distance Learning Child Care Program

Includes options for 2-day, 3-day and 5-day child care at proportionate rates. The child care will continue to be offered at 11 elementary school sites and 2 other sites that are operated by the county.

The new reduced monthly fees are listed below. Parents who wish to enroll children in a full day program (7:40 a.m. - 6:00 p.m.) should register for both the school day and after school sessions.

SCHOOL DAY (7:40 a.m. - 2:30 p.m.)

5 days per week: \$345/month 3 days per week: \$204/month 2 days per week: \$136/month

AFTER SCHOOL (2:30 – 6:00 p.m.) 5 days per week: \$345/month 3 days per week: \$204/month 2 days per week: \$136/month

eligible for a 50 percent discount.
