THE STATES OF AMERICA IT'S A NEW DAY IN VIRGINIA! **NEW HEALTH COVERAGE RULES FOR GREEN CARD HOLDERS!**

What Health Coverage Rules Are Changing For Immigrants?

In the past, Green Card holders (also called lawful permanent residents) with five years or more of residency in the United States had to show proof of 40 quarters (10 years) of work history to qualify for health coverage from Virginia Medicaid. This work requirement will end March 31, 2021.

What Does This Mean?





Starting April 1, 2021, Green Card holders (lawful permanent residents) with five years or more 1 of residency in the United States may now be eligible for free or low-cost health coverage from Virginia Medicaid. The five years starts from the date you entered into the United States.

What Is Virginia Medicaid?

Virginia Medicaid is complete health insurance. It covers doctor visits, prescriptions, hospital care, dental care, and much more.



There are other ways to get health coverage including for asylees, refugees, legally residing children, pregnant women, immigrants and other qualified non-citizens needing emergency care. It is important to apply to see if you qualify!





COVID-19 Vaccinations Expanded to Phase 2

Vaccinations **Expanded to** Phase 2 NCLUDES ALL RESIDENTS

Effective Monday, April 12, 2021, **Loudoun County is expanding** COVID-19 vaccination opportunities to include all Loudoun County residents who are 16 years of age and

older. Pre-register for a COVID-19 vaccine, please note that anyone under 18 receiving the vaccine MUST be accompanied by a parent or guardian during the vaccination appointment or you will be turned away.

How to Pre-Register:

Anyone 16 years of age and older who lives or works in Virginia can pre-register for a COVID-19 vaccine in one of two ways:

- Online: Visit vaccinate.virginia.gov to submit a preregistration form. The fastest method for receiving a vaccination appointment is to include a unique email address in separate pre-registration forms for each individual who will receive a vaccine.
- Phone: Individuals who do not have access to the internet can pre-register by calling 1-877-829-4682.
